Verizon FiOS: Let there be Light

Fiber Optic Internet, Phone and Television.

You may have noticed

that there has been a fair bit of digging on the grounds of Paul Revere Village recently. Verizon contractors have been busy laying the conduit through

which fiber optic cable will run to reach each townhouse in PRV.

Through this fiber optic cable Verizon will be able to deliver high speed internet access, phone service and eventually television.

The FiOS service should be available in mid May of this year. The television service will come later in June.

Back at the end of November 2007 most units had preinstallation work to allow the ready installation of the fiber optic cable. If your unit has not
