





I picked up enough to do all the windows in the house and it cost about a total of \$15-\$20. I purchased them from Lowes and they also have a big sheet to do the bay window. My heat doesn't turn on nearly as much as it use to and my electric bill has come down because less cold drafts are making it into the house. I'm really impressed with how well they work. I really was not a believer in them until I gave them a try, and I'm really glad I did.

On a cold December morning, I wrapped Crosby in a blanket and took him to our vet in Rutland. He could no longer walk, had stopped eating and was starting to suffer. Many of our PRVA friends and neighbors would see Crosby when they walked by our back yard on Concord Road and would always ask the same question-

"What kind of dog is that?"

Crosby was not a dog, but a Dingo, which is not related to the domestic dog, but is a Lupus, cousin to a wolf, fox and coyote. Crosby did not have the ability to bark (only howl), could only digest raw meat and lived to be 17 ^{1/2} years old. He was found in a New York City shelter and was adopted by Randy's brother and his wife. Randy and I adopted Crosby from them when they could no longer care for him after they had two small children. Crosby brought joy into our lives every day and never gave us a moment of trouble. Crosby had increasing health issues and I would drive him weekly to North Andover for acupuncture and homeopathy, which gave him a few more good years.

Randy and I miss Crosby every day, especially during the holidays, but he had a good life his last 4 years with us.
