HIKING WITH GPS IN HAND - MAPPING THE NEARBY TRAILS

Some of you may not be aware of the fact that just to the North of Paul Revere Village there is wilderness conservation land and land owned by the Grafton Land Trust teeming with trails.

I've hiked the majority of the trails back there and have even snowshoed some of them during the Winter months.

Recently, I decided to start taking a handheld Global Positioning System (GPS) receiver with me on my hikes. This allows me to collect fairly accurate latitude and longitude position data as I hike. The GPS unit stores this data making a track or trace of where I've been; sort of like electronic bread crumbs. Hansel and Gretel never had it this good.

Later, once I'm back home, I can upload this GPS data to my computer and overlay it onto a

topographical map or satellite image of the terrain. This yields a suitable map for later navigation.

I'll try to record multiple tracks of the major trails. Since there is always some measurement error in the GPS's recorded location having multiple tracks of a trail allows me to average the tracks reducing the error somewhat. Even without this averaging most measurements are accurate to within 30 feet or less.

If anyone else has an interest in taking a walk on the wilderness conservation land or in helping me collect GPS data on the trails contact me. I hope to release the first map by the end of May.

RECIPE - SOUR CREAM CHERRY NUT CAKE

- 2 sticks butter, softened
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 3 eggs
- 1 pint sour cream
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 2 tsp almond extract
- 3 cups flour
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1 cup maraschino cherries, halved
- 1 cup chopped walnuts

Preheat oven to 350°
Grease and flour tube pan. (Pam for baking may be used instead.)

Cream softened butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, incorporating each. Add sour cream followed by vanilla and almond extracts. Add dry ingredients and mix well. Stir in cherries and walnuts. Pour batter into prepared tube pan and bake in preheated oven at 350° for 70 minutes. Toothpick inserted will come out clean. Watch cake after 60 minutes. Allow cake to cool completely before removing to cooling rack.
